<p>1:1-17 Generations of the Messiah</p> <p>Sons of Abraham and David: some blessed, others deported; other ancestors, added from other nations, such as Rahab, Ruth ... and finally, Jesus, the Christ</p> <p>1 The book of the <u>genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham.</u> 11 <u>Jechoniah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon.</u> 16 and <u>Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ.</u></p>	<p>3:1-12 John the Baptist's Ministry</p> <p>Sons of Abraham (prophet, Genesis 20:7): one preached; some repented; some would not escape punishment; some would be raised from the stones?</p> <p>5 Then <u>Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan</u> were going out to him, 3:6 and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. 7 You <u>brood (generation) of vipers!</u> Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 9 ... do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father,' for I tell you, <u>God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham.</u></p>	<p>5:1-16 The Beatitudes</p> <p>God's inheriting sons: Personal traits, blessings and influence</p> <p>3 for theirs is the <u>kingdom of heaven.</u> 4 for they shall be <u>comforted.</u> 5 for they shall <u>inherit the earth.</u> 6 for they shall be <u>satisfied.</u> 7 for they shall <u>receive mercy.</u> 8 for they shall <u>see God.</u> 9 for they shall be <u>called sons of God.</u> 10 for theirs is the <u>kingdom of heaven.</u> 12 for your <u>reward is great in heaven.</u></p> <p>... for so they persecuted the <u>prophets</u> who were before you.</p> <p>13 You are the <u>salt of the earth</u> ... 14 You are the <u>light of the world</u> ...</p>
<p>1:18-25 The Birth of Jesus</p> <p>The Lord fulfills his word</p> <p>18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be <u>with child from the Holy Spirit.</u> 19 And her husband Joseph, being a <u>just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly.</u> 21 "She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." 23 "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel (which means, <u>God with us</u>)."</p> <p>22 All this took place <u>to fulfill</u> what the Lord had spoken by the prophet ...</p>	<p>3:13-17 The Baptism of Jesus</p> <p>The Lord fulfills all righteousness</p> <p>16 And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the <u>Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him;</u> 17 and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is <u>my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.</u>"</p> <p>15 "But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us <u>to fulfill all righteousness.</u>" Then he (John) consented.</p>	<p>5:17-48 The Law and the Prophets</p> <p>The Lord fulfills the Law and the Prophets</p> <p>48 You therefore must be <u>perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.</u></p> <p>5:17 Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but <u>to fulfill them.</u></p>
<p>2:1-18 The Wise Men and Herod's Attack</p> <p>Herod did not want Jesus to be worshipped</p> <p>2 "For we saw his star when it rose and have come <u>to worship him.</u>" 8 "when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and <u>worship him.</u>" 11 they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and <u>worshiped him.</u> 16 Herod ... <u>killed all the male children ... two years old or under ...</u></p>	<p>4:1-11 The Temptation of Satan</p> <p>Satan sought to be worshipped</p> <p>8 Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. 9 And he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and <u>worship me.</u>" 10 Then Jesus said to him, "Be gone, Satan! For it is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve."</p>	<p>6:1-18 Your Righteousness under Attack</p> <p>The hypocrite seeks to be praised</p> <p>1 "Beware of practicing your righteousness <u>before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.</u> 2 "Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, <u>that they may be praised by others.</u>"</p>
<p>2:19-23 Nazareth Where Jesus Lived</p> <p>God warned Joseph by revelation</p> <p>19 an angel of the Lord appeared (q5316. φαίνω <u>phainō, to shine</u>) in a dream to Joseph ... 22 being warned (q5537. χρηματίζω <u>chrēmatizō, revealed</u>) in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee.</p>	<p>4:12-25 Capernaum Where He Worked</p> <p>Jesus shined as a great light (illumination)</p> <p>16 "... the people dwelling in darkness have seen a <u>great light, and for those dwelling in the region and shadow of death, on them a light has dawned.</u>"</p>	<p>6:19-7:29 What to Do and not Do</p> <p>Jesus taught with authority</p> <p>28 And when Jesus finished these sayings, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, 29 for he was <u>teaching them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes.</u></p>
