JUDGES: SPIRITUAL WARFARE

MARRIAGE: WINNING OR LOSING? OTHNIEL AND SAMSON

Text: Judges 1:1-3:11 and chapters 13-16

- 1. How did God test Israel during the period of the Judges after Joshua died? What did God teach Israel during that period of time (Judges 3:1-6)?
- 2. What was one of the main reasons Israel went away from the Lord (Judges 3:6)?
- 3. Who was the first judge? What did the Lord do for him? What were the two steps he took in bringing Israel back to the Lord (Judges 3:7-11).
- 4. The first judge married Acsah. Who was she and how did he marry her? When Caleb offered her to the man who would attack Debir what did he want in a son-in-law? What was she like? There were 2 things she wanted. What were they? How did the 2 things she wanted fit into God's plans for his people? Remember what God had promised Abraham, Isaac and Jacob (Judges 1:11-15 and Genesis 12:7). Why was marrying Acsah by the first judge an answer to the spiritual and moral problems of Israel?
- 5. How were Samson's women different from Acsah? Who were they and how could you characterize them morally and spiritually (Judges 14:1-3; 16:1-3 and 16:4-6)?
- 6. As you think about the wars of Samson against the Philistines how would you describe these battles (Judges 13:5; 14:10-19; 14:20-15:8; 15:9-17 and 16:27-30)? Would you describe these battles as God's battles or Samson's?
- 7. What do the following cases, both positive and negative teach about how important the relationship between men and women is in spiritual life and ministry?
 - Solomon (I Kings 11:1-11)
 - Joshua (Joshua 23:12, 13 ... Joshua 24:15)
 - Ahab (I Kings 21:25)
 - II Corinthians 6:14
 - Acts 18:24-28
